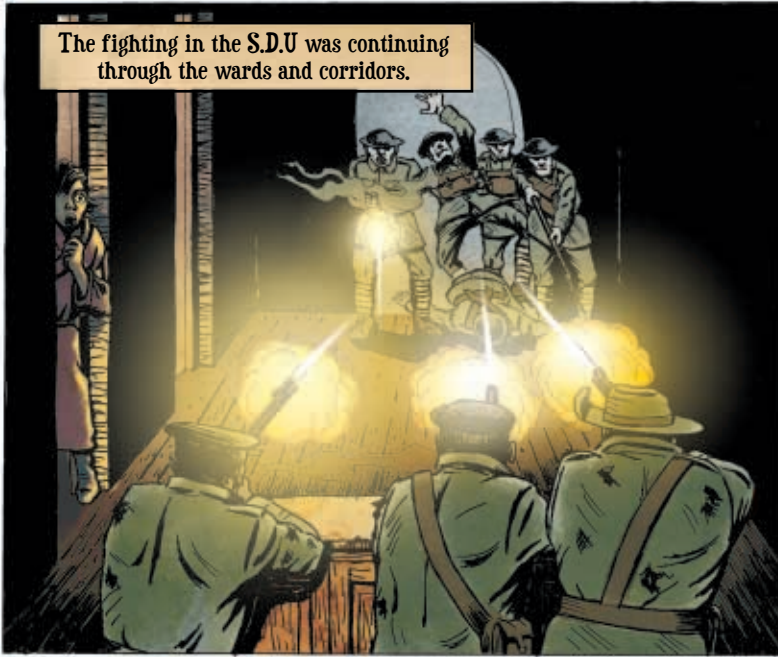


The fighting in the S.D.U was continuing through the wards and corridors.
